It means the grass is being fertilized by leaking sewage. This suggests that your system is leaking effluent into the upper soil layers rather than filtering it properly.
- **5. Sewage Backups in the House** This is the ultimate nightmare scenario. If dark, smelly water starts coming up through your drains, you have a critical failure. This usually happens in the lowest drains first, such as a basement floor drain or a downstairs shower. At this

point, you must stop using water immediately and call for emergency repair.
